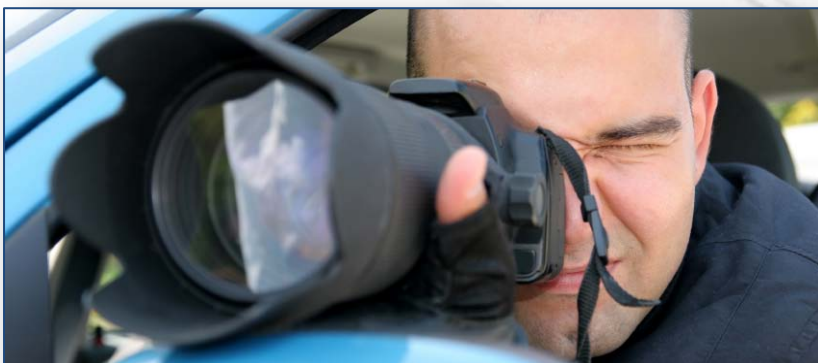

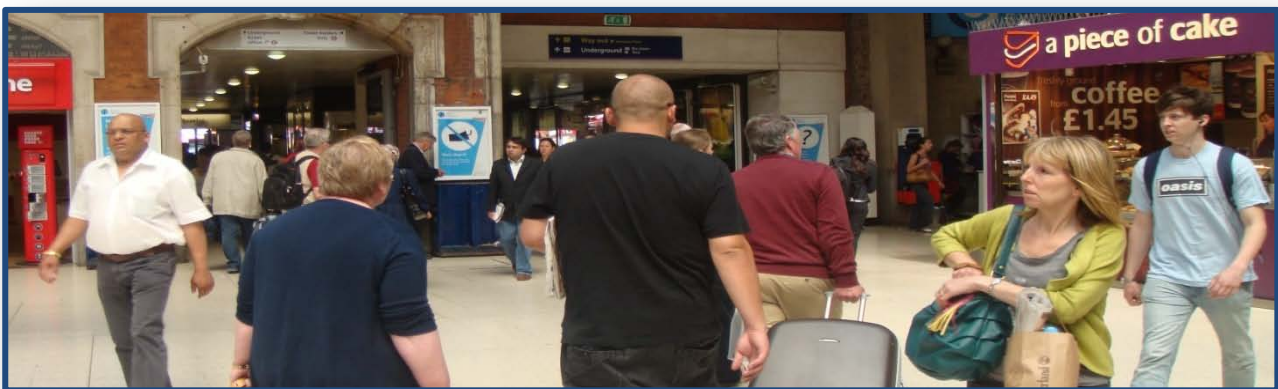


Foot and Mobile Surveillance

The BTEC Level 3 Advanced Award in Foot and Mobile Surveillance has been developed to provide those considering a career in surveillance or investigations with the knowledge and skills required to conduct surveillance investigations in a variety of areas. The course is suitable for anyone considering a career as a surveillance operator or those already working within a variety of professions where surveillance skills complement their role, including:

- Private Investigators
- Close Protection Officers
- Store Detectives
- Security Consultants
- Environment Agency
- Institute of Trading Standards
- Military units
- Local Authorities
- Bailiffs
- Enforcement Officers
- Security Managers
- Government Agency & Social Services

During the BTEC Level 3 a range of mandatory subjects are covered including: Planning and Preparation, Foot and Mobile Surveillance techniques, Observation Skills, Static Surveillance, Technical Surveillance and Vehicle Tracking, Communications Skills, Evidence and Intelligence gathering, Law Legislation applicable to surveillance.



The current economic climate and political changes have seen a rise in fraudulent insurance and benefit claims with many organisations and government departments turning their attention to exposing and reducing such claims. Employing surveillance operatives has in the past proved a successful way of achieving this and no doubt operatives will continue to expose a range of activities such as benefit fraud, fly tipping, fraudulent insurance claims, marital affairs, theft, espionage and more.

Course Structure.

A combination of teaching and learning activities are used with a well planned mixture of classroom based sessions and practical exercises leading to a final surveillance operation where your skills will be assessed. This will see you and your team conducting a surveillance operation using a vehicles, buses, trains and foot surveillance skills as part of a surveillance team.

Unit 1 – Working as a Surveillance Operator

This unit introduces you to the multitude of environments that surveillance is used in and you will learn the underpinning knowledge and theory required as a surveillance operator. This will give you the skills needed to operate commercially and to plan for operations. Through a mixture of case studies and our specialist instructors prior experience you will discover the range and diversity of surveillance operations along with the many problems that may be encountered when conducting surveillance

Unit 2 – Foot and Mobile Surveillance

This mainly practical unit is when you will be taught how to conduct surveillance on foot, vehicles and public transport. You will develop your skills within the team working with both small teams and larger teams in a variety of environments. During the practical phases you will learn about imagery acquisition and evidence gathering as well as team working skills. You will need to navigate unknown areas, relay information to the team and acquire relevant imagery and video footage.



Unit 3 – Legal and Evidential Issues

Evidence is an important part of surveillance and can take many forms ranging from video footage, photography, witness testimony and even forensics and physical evidence such as documents or audio recordings of a conversation.

It is imperative that commercial surveillance operators are aware of and operate within the law to ensure that any evidence is permissible should it be required for use in legal cases. As part of the training you will develop your technical skills in producing imagery and collecting vital evidence. All of this needs to be collected during operations and must be collected legally if it is to be used as evidence.

Course Instructors

Our surveillance course instructors all come from specialist military and police surveillance backgrounds many having worked with Special Forces and the security services for many years. All course instructors have a wealth of operational and teaching experience.

Entry Requirements

There are no specific pre-course entry requirements however candidates will need to be able to communicate in English and will be required to interpret and produce written documentation and reports.

Booking

Assessment and Certification

Course assessment takes place by completion of a workbook and through practical exercises. Candidates that complete all of the training elements and meet the assessment criteria will be awarded a BTEC Level 3 Advanced Award in Foot and Mobile Surveillance.
